Background


## About KNBS

KNBS is the principal Government agency mandated by the Statistics Act, 2006 to be the custodian of all official Statistics in Kenya.

## Vision

- To be a global leader in the provision of quality statistical services


## Mission Statement

- To provide, manage and promote quality statistical services through utilization of best practices for evidence-based decision making


## Specific Functions of KNBS

The specific functions of KNBS as defined in the Statistics (Amendment) Act, 2019 are:

- Planning, authorising, coordinating and supervising all official statistical programmes undertaken within the NSS;
- Establishing standards and ensuring the use of best practices and methods in the production and dissemination of statistical information across the NSS;

Collecting, compiling, analysing, abstracting and disseminating statistical information;

- Conducting the Population and Housing Census every ten years, and such other censuses and surveys as the Board may determine;
- Maintaining a comprehensive and reliable national socio-economic database;


## Specific Functions of KNBS Cont...'

- Developing and maintaining sampling frames of the Bureau;
- Collaborating with and assisting the county governments or any institutions in the production of official statistics;
- Providing technical advice on statistics to other state entities;

Promoting co-ordination among producers, users and suppliers of official statistics by forming appropriate sector committees; and

- Designating statistics produced by national statistical system as official statistics on being satisfied that the necessary criteria have been followed.


## KNBS Structure

The Bureau has five Directorates namely:

- Macroeconomics Statistics;
- Population and Social Statistics;
- Production Statistics;

Statistical Coordination and Methods (Strategy, research, NSS and Sampling Frames);

- Corporate Services (ICT, Communication, Finance and HR)

## Objectives of 2019 KPHC

Provides the government and other users with information on the population

- Specifically to ascertain;
- Size, composition, and spatial distribution
- Levels of fertility, mortality and migration
- Educational attainment
- Household composition
- Rate and pattern of urbanization
- Size and deployment of labour force
- Distribution of persons with disability
- Housing conditions and availability of household amenities
- Agricultural indicators to inform the creation of agriculture frame


## Uses of 2019 KPHC

Uses of Census data includes the following:

- Resource allocation across counties and National Government Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs);
- Planning, budgeting, programming and policy formulation ;
- Development of a National Master Household Sampling Frame;
- Development of Geo-Spatial Database that will help mapping of indicators;
- Benchmark for agricultural census/surveys; business, industry and labour;

Creation of administrative and political units;

- Formulation of housing policy and programmes;
- Aid in further research on population and development;
- Reporting on MTP III, African Agenda 2063 and SDGS indicators;
- Calculation of approximately 98 of the 232 SDG indicators require population data.


## Census Phases

- A census is implemented in three main phases namely
- Pre-enumeration (preparatory phase)- longest and started in 2016
- Enumeration
- Post-enumeration

Currently we are implementing post enumeration activities for the 2019 census;

## 2019 Census Enumeration

- It was a de facto census and enumeration covered all conventional, nonconventional households and special population;
- First census where technology was used during cartographic mapping and census enumeration;
- A total of 164,000 mobile devices were assembled by two local Universities;
- Pre-enumeration listing of households was done on 22nd and 23rd August, 20/9:
Actual enumeration was successfully conducted from 24th/25th -31st August, 2019;
Mop up exercise was carried out on 1 st and 2 nd of September to enumerate households that were not enumerated during the enumeration period

## Other Key Highlights

The following is the distribution of the population by age categories:

- The population aged below 35 years was 35,700,787 (75.1 \%) in 2019 compared to 30,237,255 (78.3 \%) in 2009.
- Children (0-14 years) were 18,541,982 (39.0 \%) in 2019 compared to 16,571,877 (43 \%) in 2009.
- Adolescents (10-19 years) were 11,631,929 (24.5 \%) in 2019 compared to 9, 204,398 ( $23.8 \%$ ) in 2009.
- The youth population (18-34 years) was 13,777,600 (29.0 \%) in 2019 compared to 11,809,518 (28.7 \%) in 2009.
- Population of working age (15-64 years) was 27,151,134 (57.1 \%) in 2019 compared to 20,684,861 (53.6\%) in 2009.
- The elderly population (65+ years) was 1,870,493 persons (3.9 \%) in 2019 compared to $1,332,273$ persons ( $\mathbf{3 . 4 5} \%$ ) in 2009. The females accounting for 55.8 per cent of the elderly in 2019 compared to 54.8 per cent in 2009.

## 2019 Census Implications

## Implications

- Census data forms the denominator upon which a number of indicators are derived;
- The already published basic report gives population data up to lower levels which counties can use in planning;
- As directed by the President, all stakeholders are requested to use the census findings to make informed decisions or formulate policies at various levels;
Counties can use the census information to monitor their performance in various sectors;
- The census information can be used for allocation of resources at various levels;
- It forms the basis for conducting further research in specific areas;
- Further, the findings can assist the counties in prioritizing on their projects taking into considerations variations in development within the County.

Where:
CA =Revenue allocated to county
i = County: 1,2......... 47.
$\mathrm{PN}_{\mathrm{i}}=$ Revenue allocated to a county on the basis of Population Factor.
$E S_{i}=$ Revenue allocated to a county on the basis of Equal Share factor. This is shared equally among the 47 counties.
$\mathbf{P I}_{\mathbf{i}}=$ Revenue allocated to a county on the basis of Poverty Factor.
$\mathbf{L A}_{\mathbf{i}}=$ Revenue allocated to a county on the basis of Land Area Factor.
$\mathrm{FE}_{\mathbf{i}}=$ Revenue allocated to a given county on the basis of Fiscal Effort.
$D_{\mathbf{i}}=$ Revenue allocated to a given county on the basis of Development Factor.
