# National Assembly

#### **Special Seat Members**

- Necessary to ensure that no more than two-thirds of the membership of Parliament are of the same gender
- E.g. If among the 366 there is yet to be achieved a 2/3 gender rule (122 Women) then more women will be nominated to fulfill the rule (this is unpredictable





National Assembly Senate Parliament

#### 2010 Constitution (excluding speakers)

#### **BBI Increase**

 Women to achieve 2/3 gender rule

- The National Assembly has 76 Women,
- Still short by 41 seats to make 117 or one-third of the 349 MPs 290 elected, 47 woman representatives and 12 nominated members.

### **COST** - Parliamentary Budget Office

The cost of sustaining one MP is pegged at KSh30 million annually

Avg Tot cost - 1 constituency office per year is KSh12 million

the current annual Legislature's budget is 2 per cent of the national budget, translating to Sh39 billion.

- Whose political party or coalition of parties has at least 25% of all the members of the National Assembly.
- Prime Minister is not appointed from the person's political party or coalition of parties.





# Public Wage Bill

- Sept 2016 socio-economic audit report on the 2010 constitution by the working group chaired by former Auditor-General Edward Ouko.
- Cost of implementing the 2010 constitution is too high... running a very expensive government that will be difficult to maintain. Calling for constitutional amendments to reduce the size of government.
- "A growing public wage bill will crowd out resources for the development budget, and by that affect economic growth,"



#### Public Wage Bill

- The budget of the national executive-ministries, department, and agencies had increased by 21 percent from Sh1.011 billion in 2013/14 to Sh1.461 billion in 2015/16.
- This translates to every Kenyan contributing, on average, slightly over Sh25,000 per year, or about Sh2,083 per month, to support the running of the national executive.

# Kenya Pensions

- In 2018, The Treasury issued an alert over the mounting pension bill,
- Warning that the expense is a risk to the Budget
- "The pension Budget had increased by over three-fold in the last 10 years from Sh25 billion in the financial year 2008/09 to Sh86 billion in FY 2018/19.

"This is unsustainable," the Treasury informed Parliament in a note.

- In the FY2020/2021 The Pension budget stands at 136Billion (136,978,000,000)
  - Ordinary Pension Kshs. 57.2 billion
  - Commuted pension (Gratuities) Kshs. 61.7 billion.
  - Retired state officers: a) Chief Justice, b) Deputy
     Chief Justice, c) prime minister, d) Deputy
     President or Vice President
